
# Notes from the President, John Morrison

She has been featured on leading music stages such as Carnegie Hall and Steinway Hall in New York City and, in worldwide reputable music festivals in France, Belgium, Switzerland, Austria, Germany, Spain, Portugal, China and Canada. She has worked with eminent pianists such as Paul-Badura Skoda, Alicia de Larrocha, Aldo Ciccolini, Russell Sherman, and John Perry, and is highly appraised by the legendary pianist Fou Tsong as a unique interpreter of the music of Mozart.

WVMTA 2017 Fall Conference

- ➤ There will be a collegiate Honor Recital at 8 p.m. on Thursday evening, October 26, 2017 at WVU. This recital is an initiative to actively involve collegiate members.
- ➤ 14 members registered for the Fall Conference (lower number when compared to previous years).
- > Two married couples will serve as the conference clinicians: Matthew Gianforte & Meeyoun Park, and Christopher and Katherine Fisher.

# 1st Vice President's Report (Ian Jessee)

West Virginia 2017 Competitions

- ➤ 26 students are competing in the MTNA competitions (piano, strings, brass, woodwinds, voice, strings chamber music, and woodwinds chamber music). Last year, there were 23 MTNA entries.
- ➤ 10 students are competing in the Mountain State competitions (piano, strings). Last year, there were 14 Mountain State entries.
- ➤ There are no students competing in the Adagio Strings competitions. Last year, there were 3 Adagio Strings entries.
- Factoring all of the above, the total number of students competing this year is 36. Last year, the total number of entries was 40.

### 2nd Vice President's Report (Yu-Hsuan Liao, in absentia)

- ➤ As of October 26, 2017, the membership total for WVMTA is 90.

# Treasurer's Report (Henning Vauth)
